

Coast Guard Auxiliary Restructures National Organization

Coast Guard Auxiliary National Commodore Nick Kerigan announced major changes to Coast Guard Auxiliary National Organization. The staff is being organized to mesh closely with Coast Guard organization to facilitate greater synergies and effectiveness as the Coast Guard moves toward implementing Modernization, Kerigan said. This reorganization will enable the Auxiliary to meet future needs and will facilitate performance and readiness. Deputy National Commodores (Two Stars) are established for Operations, Operations Policy, Mission Support, and Force Readiness.

Assistant National Commodores (One Star) will oversee Response & Prevention, RBS, Operations Policy & Resources, International Affairs, Mission Support, Chief Information Officer, Readiness Support, and Planning & Performance Support, Chief Counsel, and Strategic Analysis. On The Air With Flotilla 4 Members of Flotilla 4 will take to the airwaves as K0G on October 17th. Flotilla 4 members will go on the air to participate in the Coast Guard Auxiliary's "Special Event Amateur Radio Day 2009." This special event has been running for the past 11 years, and now has up to 60 U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary High Frequency (HF) stations operational for this year's event. The event commemorates the 70th anniversary of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and HF Stations from all across the country will be operational on amateur radio frequencies all day during this event. Flotilla 4 will operate from an HF station ran by Tony Radebaugh (N0NI) on his acreage outside of Perry. This unique facility has over twenty radio towers and an unknown number of antennas from which to transmit. Last Course of the Season


A boating safety class is a great way to cap off an operational season. On October 8th and 10th, Flotilla 4 hosted an About Boating Safely class at the Saylorville Lake Oak Woods Learning Center. The class is an introductory course designed to meet the boating education needs of recreational boaters.

The benefit to a face-to-face class is the ability to answer questions, demonstrate equipment and further explain the application of boating procedures. This class had four students with varied boating backgrounds.

"Students were able to learn about boating and navigation rules, parts of a boat, proper operator safety and emergency procedures." said instructor Doug Jansen. "We were able to show the students different boating safety devices and explain why they are so important to a boater."

Instructors for the class were Jeff Towle, Norma Newton and Doug Jansen.

Flotilla 4 will offer the About Boating Safety class again in May of 2010 at Saylorville Lake and Lake Red Rock.

ICS 341 is an Incident Response Planning Workshop which is a four-day Coast Guard position specific course that presents the concepts, principles, and protocols of the Planning Section duties intended to familiarize students with the process mechanics of planning activities in support of an incident.

Tomlinson was the only Coast Guard Auxiliary member who participated in the training alongside 30 other active duty Coast Guard members and civilian employees. He participated in this training in order to work towards the Coast Guard qualification to be able to instruct the Incident Command System level 300 course.
